

Karl Manheim – Bio

Karl Manheim is a Professor of Law at Loyola Law School, Los Angeles, where he is in charge of the Concentration Program in Intellectual Property. He was previously Loyola Director of the Program for Law and Technology, co-sponsored by the California Institute of Technology. He has taught at the USC Law School, at the University for International Business and Economics in Beijing, at the University of Bologna, and at the University of Aix-Marseilles, France.

For 2007, Prof. Manheim was a fellow at the House of Representatives Subcommittee on Courts, the Internet and Intellectual Property, where he worked on the Patent Reform Act of 2007.

He is a co-founder and Director of a biotechnology startup in San Francisco and Mysore, India.

Prof. Manheim received his Bachelor of Science degree from Bradley University, his J.D. from Northeastern University, and his LL.M from Harvard Law School.
