
Professor Randall R. Rader

Judge Randall R. Rader has been the Chief Counsel of the US Senate Legislature since 1980, and has since served as President of the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, US Federal Circuit Court of Appeals, US Federal Appeals Chief Circuit Judge. Judge Rader has been in the Justice Department since 1988, and has served the President of the United States for 26 years until retirement in 2014. During the twenty-six years of his tenure of office, Judge Rader has been involved in drafting, legislating, and revising several important bills in the United States. The hundreds of judgments that have been written have constituted an important legal basis for today's US patent law practice. The judiciary and the global IP community are far-reaching. The "Patent Law Essentials", "Patent Law - Cases and Materials", published by his jurisprudence, are the most widely accepted textbooks on intellectual property law in the world. For his outstanding contribution to the US judiciary and the global intellectual property field, Professor Rader was named to the World Intellectual Property Hall of Fame in 2011 for the third consecutive year as the most influential person in the global intellectual property community.
